**QUARTERLY POLICING REPORT
FOR
THE MUNICIPALITY OF EAST HANTS
August 1st – October 31st, 2018**

This is the second quarterly report for fiscal year 2018/2019, for the period August 1st – October 31st, 2018. RCMP East Hants' focus remains in line with the provincial goals of road safety; overall crime reduction, and cybercrime. Our Provincial direction remains the same.

For 2018/2019, our provincial priorities are:

- Crime Prevention and Reduction which will contribute to the overall safety and security of all Nova Scotians.
- Road Safety which will contribute to safe roads and highways in Nova Scotia.
- Mitigating cybercrime in NS.
- Connecting with Aboriginal communities by enhancing relationships.

The above-noted provincial goals are being accomplished through a variety of measures. As your police force, we would like to ensure that the provincial priorities are in line with local concerns. It is important to RCMP East Hants that we address any concerns and/or complaints impacting our citizens, and that we remain engaged and involved in our community.

For the Municipality of East Hants we will be targeting: Crime Prevention and Reduction through our contribution to the safety and security of all residents; Road Safety through increased traffic contacts and checkpoints; and Cyber Crime increasing our (Police Member's) knowledge/education in the area of technology investigations.

- ❖ **Crime Prevention and Reduction** - We continue to spend considerable time focusing our efforts on crime reduction initiatives to reduce 'Crimes Against Persons' and 'Property Crime'. Examples of 'Crimes Against Persons' include: assault, robbery, threats, harassment, etc. Examples of 'Property Crime' include: Break and Enter, thefts, damage to property, etc.
 - During this quarter, East Hants had 70 Reported Crimes Against Persons and 133 reported Crimes Against Property. Although stats are captured at a particular moment in time and change frequently, we can say that these numbers are consistent when compared to the same period for 2017.
 - Our compliance checks of persons on Conditional Sentence Offender (CSO) program is continuing with regular checks on offenders. These checks are at random times and prove to be successful in keeping a tight leash on those offenders.
 - The team approach for our School Liaison and Community Policing Officers is proving successful. Cst Krista Myers together with Cst Terry Fogarty have been involved with a number of school and community events including community parades/fun Days, Senior friendship cafe, senior fraud presentations, eight code blue drills at schools and three code blacks.
- ❖ **Road Safety** – During the last quarter, our Road Safety priorities focused aggressive driving/speeding, motorcycle safety and distracted driving. For this quarter our focus was on impaired driving, back to school, and Highway Safety. During this quarter East Hants had a number of Road Safety initiatives including:

- Members of East Hants District partnering with the NEN Traffic Unit, MADD and Vehicle Compliance Inspectors to conduct various check points;
 - Extra members on during long weekends for high visibility and special enforcement;
 - Publication education through local media involving the Move Over Legislation;
 - Accessing a fully unmarked police operation police vehicle to be used for various enforcement opportunities;
- ❖ **Cyber Crime** – East Hants members continue to fully investigate all cybercrime investigations and the collection of technological evidence. We work closely with a Tech Crime Unit and continue to leverage this expertise when necessary. East Hants members continue with ongoing education to stay current on Tech crime and cybercrime trends. School and public presentations continue to be the mainstay of our strategy to educate our public and thereby protect them from cybercrime.

COMMUNITY POLICING / SSRO:

- East Hants RCMP participated in many community events over the last quarter including Community Fun Days, Senior Friendship Cafe, Hants County Senior Safety Association Meeting, fraud presentations as well as seatbelt and car seat safety talks;
- Numerous Halloween Safety presentations delivered;
- Remembrance Day ceremonies and parades throughout East Hants District;
- Checkpoints were held and educational “Don’t Drive High” pamphlets handed out on the new Cannabis Act and enforcement legislation. Numerous community and school talks have also been given;
- The East Hants Crime Prevention Association meets approximately every three months. In October Cst. Chad Morrison gave a presentation regarding the new drug impaired driving legislation as well as police investigative abilities and techniques;
- Eight Code Blue and three Code Black drills executed at various East Hants Schools;
- “Crime Stoppers promotes the reduction of crime through community based effort to provide appropriate authorities with the information needed to lay charges against those responsible. Crime Stoppers endeavors to encourage the community to assist local law enforcement agencies in the fight against crime by overcoming two key elements that inhibit community involvement: Fear and Apathy. Crime Stoppers goal is to make our communities a safer place to live and conduct business. A person can contact Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477 (T.I.P.S.) or via the web (Submit Secure Web Tip) and relays their information anonymously. During the call, the tipster is given a confidential number which is what they will use whenever they call to update the police coordinator’s office. The onus is on the tipster to re-contact Crime Stoppers. If the case is solved by the tipster’s tip, and an arrest is made and charges are laid, the tipster qualifies for a cash reward. SIGNIFICANT POLICE OCCURRENCES:

- **August:** Belnan Theft of black Hyundai from driveway. Recovered burnt in Halifax District area.
- **August:** North Noel Stolen Kawasaki side by side stolen from yard.
- **September:** East Hants RCMP executed a search warrant at a residence on North Uniacke Lake Road and seized several marihuana plants. A 61-year-old male has been charged with Production of Substances under the Controlled Drug and Substances Act and is scheduled to appear in Shubenacadie Provincial Court.
- **September:** East Hants member was monitoring neighboring detachments occurrences and it was noted that there had been a minor MVC in the Colchester area where the driver appeared impaired. Later a call for a minor MVC was dispatched to East Hants District. Upon arrival at the scene, the driver of one of the vehicles appeared to be impaired. Her vehicle matched the description of the occurrence in Truro and the driver also matched the description. She was transported to the Sackville Detachment where it was confirmed after a DRE test that she was indeed impaired.
- **September:** Report of a stolen vehicle from an auto shop in Hardwoodlands, a red Mustang that had been left there for repair had been taken. Upon further investigating it was discovered that the previous evening at a Bible Hill RCMP had recovered the stolen vehicle at checkpoint. The investigation determined that a red Mustang had pulled over before the checkpoint and the driver exited the vehicle and ran off into the woods.
- **September:** Report of home invasion in the Latties Brook area – male forced way into home and insisted home owner provide him a drive to another location. Suspect was known to the complainant. Suspect arrested and incarcerated.
- **October:** Multiple thefts from vehicles in the Nine Mile River/Elmsdale area. Investigated in conjunction with HRP GIS and charges are being laid.
- **October:** Theft of tools from a local hardware store, left in a white Kia. Investigation ongoing. Possible connection with suspect out of the city.
