



01 -Quarterly Policing Report For East Hants

This is the second quarterly report for fiscal year 2019, for the period April 1 – June 30, 2019. RCMP East Hants' focus remains in line with the provincial goals of road safety; overall crime reduction, and cybercrime. Our Provincial direction remains the same.

For 2019, our provincial priorities are:

- Crime Prevention and Reduction which will contribute to the overall safety and security of all Nova Scotians.
- Road Safety which will contribute to safe roads and highways in Nova Scotia.
- Mitigating cybercrime in NS.

The above-noted provincial goals are being accomplished through a variety of measures. As your police force, we would like to ensure that the provincial priorities are in line with local concerns. It is important to RCMP East Hants that we address any concerns and/or complaints impacting our citizens, and that we remain engaged and involved in our community.

Note: As of September 2019, Cpl Hobin has been transferred and Cpl Lowe will be coming to East Hants as her replacement. A new School Liaison officer for this year is Cst Nick Orman. Cst Mahar will be overseeing any community policing requirements. As well, there is currently a person named as the Replacement Ops NCO.

For the Municipality of East Hants we have been targeting: Crime Prevention and Reduction through our contribution to the safety and security of all residents; Road Safety through increased traffic contacts and checkpoints; and Cyber Crime increasing our (Police Member's) knowledge/education in the area of technology investigations.



02 - Road Safety

Road Safety:

During this quarter East Hants has responded to 149 police reports with regard to highway safety. And continue to be proactive in the community by conducting 38 Police Check Stops throughout East Hants

Members responded to 53 reported Dangerous driving complaints on our highways and investigated 52 possible impaired drivers. Resulting in 12 Criminal Charges for Impaired operation of a Motor Vehicle by Alcohol and 1 Criminal Charge of Impaired by Drug .



03 - Crime Prevention and Reduction

□ **Crime Prevention and Reduction:**

We continue our efforts relating to crime reduction initiatives to reduce "Crimes Against Persons" and "Property Crimes". Examples of "Crimes Against Persons" include: assault, robbery, threats, uttering threats, harassment, etc. Examples of "Property Crime" include Break and Enter, thefts, damage to property, etc.

During this quarter, East Hants had 49 reported Crimes Against Persons and 56 reported Crimes Against Property. Stats are captured at a particular moment in time and can change frequently.

Our Compliance checks of persons on Conditional Sentence Offender (CSO) program is continuing with regular checks on offenders. These checks will remain as our consistent enforcement strategy. Any offender found in breach of his/her CSO will be brought before the courts. This quarter has resulted in East Hants RCMP laying 2 charges of Failing to Comply with Conditions of a CSO.

During this quarter the School Liaison and Community Policing Officers were shared in a team approach: Presentation given to Grade 7-1 class on drugs; Drug presentation to grade 7-2 class. Officers spoke to grade 7, 8, and 9 students, reminding them of the implications of underage drinking and drug use, in advance of the upcoming school dance; Members attended Hants East High School prom. gathering at school then driving to the prom venue, assisted with traffic and to prevent drinking, mischief; Scam talk to 38 seniors in East Hants.; Attended Noel's Seniors group for lunch and presentation on Frauds and Scams.

As well, police responded to 20 reported requests for a "Well Being" checks on members in our community. Examples of "Well Being" checks include a missing person, someone who is/could be experiencing a Mental Health or Medical Health condition/crisis or someone who lives alone and the loved one has not heard from them in an unusual time frame. Police response to these call not only ensures an individuals safety but ensures that no criminal activity has been involved.



04 - Quarterly Significant Police Occurrences

April 2019:

Report of dangerous driver resulted in a pursuit of the vehicle that was located and refused to stop. Driver endangering other motorists by driving with lights off and swerving towards oncoming traffic, driving on wrong side of road. Vehicle exited road after making contact with police vehicle. CEW deployed on driver and engaged in assaultive behavior towards police. Driver transported by EHS due to Psychosis episode, found not criminally responsible and remanded to Forensic Hospital. Decisions on any future release will be a matter for the review board.

911 Disturbance in progress open line regarding a domestic on side of the road where a child was present in the vehicle. Police attended scene, male arrested for Assault Causing Bodily Harm and Assault (two separate adults). As well, male was charged for Dangerous Driving and Mischief under. The male suspect was held for court in the morning.

Reported sexual assault, victims ex boyfriend assaulted her in the carpool parking lot while she was waiting for a friend. Suspect approached her, told her he wanted her back and using force, grabbed her and began sexually assaulting her. During the struggle to get away the victim sustained injury to her eye, cutting and causing it to bleed (black eye). Suspect was located arrested and held overnight for court in the morning. Charged and released on conditions of no contact with victim.

Enfield RCMP received a complaint of a male in the median of the 102 highway with a gun yelling for police to shoot him. Members on duty attended the location, the subject was later arrested by ERT and taken back to cells where he refused a breath demand. The suspect was arrested on multiple firearms charges as well as refusal of a breath demand and held in custody. The suspect was sentenced to 4 years and 90 days in custody.

May 2019:

Theft from a business, the complainant knew the suspect, witnessed the crime and stated there's business video surveillance of the theft. Approximately \$170 in goods stolen. Descriptions of the suspect, vehicle she was driving and direction of travel was obtained from the complainant. Suspect identified and investigation is still open. Charges pending of Theft Under \$5000, Trafficking in property obtained by crime and Possession of Property obtained by crime.

911 call, impaired driver in progress. The complainant reported that the suspect vehicle had "slightly" ran into a business and was now in the drive thru . Police made a patrol, the suspect was not located immediately, but located at his mother's, passed out inside, still in possession of a dozen cheeseburgers. The suspect was arrested and blew 170/180mg%. Suspect plead guilty and was sentenced.

911 call, complainant reported a female got out of a car and walked into the service station crying, bloodied and asking for help. The male suspect had followed the victim into the service station but quickly left on foot heading west. Members attended and noted the offence was also related to a previous domestic violence against the victim. The suspect was located, arrested for Assault and Assault Causing bodily Harm, and released on conditions not to have any contact with the victim.

June 2019:

Member doing patrol to look for seatbelt, cell phone and speeding violations in Minasville. Noted a vehicle traveling on the 215 Hwy at an excessive speed. Member activated full emergency equipment, vehicle failed to stop and member lost sight of the suspect vehicle due to increasing speed and windy road. Following a search of the area the member located the suspect vehicle abandoned off the "Old Road". While patrolling area, suspects returned to vehicle and attempted to flee. Located and arrested for flight.

Disturbing the Peace, members attended a ball field where there was a report of two suspects having a consensual fight. Approximately 30 children between ages 7 and 12 at ball practice in the ball field. Numerous kids upset and crying. Ball practice canceled for the night. Video of fight obtained from open source social media. Both suspects charged with Causing Disturbance.



05 - Cybercrime

□ **Cyber Crime:** –

Cyber crime remains a provincial priority for the RCMP. We work closely with a Tech Crime Unit and continue to leverage this expertise when necessary. East Hants members continue with ongoing education to stay current on Tech crime and cybercrime trends. Schools and public presentations continue to be the mainstay of our strategy to educate our public and thereby protecting them from cybercrime.

During this reporting period, East Hants District RCMP responded to 13 reported occurrences of Fraud resulting in 1 Criminal Charge of Fraud of Under \$5,000, two of the Fraud investigations remain open as of this date.
