Thank You, East Hants Heroes

As our community knows, the East Hants
Aquatic Centre was significantly impacted by
the storm and we anticipate a lengthy closure.

Increasing Water & Wastewater Capacity

East Hants is committed to meeting the needs of our growing population. Our 2021-2024 Strategic Plan includes goals for Sustainable Infrastructure, including updating existing water and wastewater plants to meet community needs for years to come. We have two exciting projects currently underway to meet this goal:

The **Enfield Water Treatment Plant** serves the communities of Enfield, Lantz and Elmsdale. Work began over the summer to add another treatment tank and filter unit to the plant. This allows for more water to be treated each cycle and therefore more users to be included in the system. The update will progress into the testing and launching phases during the fall months.



The **Shubenacadie Wastewater Treatment Plant** upgrade project passed several exciting milestones over the summer. Construction of the process building was completed in June and work to install the control system is currently ongoing. Construction of the main treatment and holding tanks, grit chamber and screening building began with a targeted completion date



of Spring 2024. The new plant will significantly increase the facility's capacity and open doors for new development opportunities in the community.

Investing in Stronger Communities

The Municipality of East Hants recognizes the importance of community-based organizations. Council allocated over \$1.2 million in community grants in 2022-2023. Of that amount, over \$110,000 went to District Recreation Funds - grants for nonprofit organizations to assist with maintenance, enhancement and/or upgrades of their spaces. Here are two recently completed recipient projects:

Nine Mile River Community Hall: Solar Project

The Nine Mile River Community Hall provides residents with a full-service multi-functional indoor and outdoor recreation space to gather. The organization installed a Solar Energy system to reduce annual energy costs and carbon footprint.



East Gore Community Hall: Roof Replacement

The East Gore Community Hall is a space for the entire community to use! The organization used District Recreation Funds to replace the asphalt shingle roof with a metal roof. Keeping the building in great shape means this space will be ready for community activities for years to come!



Get to Know East Hants

East Hants is a haven for many creatures, great and small! Read on to learn more about some of our region's most environmentally important areas.

Burntcoat Head Park is home to a federally protected mollusk species called the Atlantic Mud-piddock. It is a unique species that burrows into the red mudstone in the Minas Basin and lives in one small burrow for its

entire adult lifespan. You can help protect the mud-piddocks living in the ocean floor mudstone by staying to the right of Burntcoat's Flowerpot Island (pictured

above), during your park visit.

East Hants is also home to two Nova Scotia Treasured Wetlands: South Maitland Marsh, located beside the Fundy Tidal Interpretive Centre, (designated in 2020) and Lock 6 Park in Enfield (designated in 2023, pictured right). Both of these sites have walking trails and interpretive panels highlighting their unique ecosystems. Click "Learn More" to watch a video about the South Maitland Marsh.

Emergency Kits


Ensure you have adequate supplies to support every member of your household for a minimum of 72 hours without power. Don't forget to have a kit for your vehicle as well!

Protect Your Home

- Water (1L/person per day)
