- East Hants District total of 30 employees (26 Police officers, 4 Detachment Assistants)
- Current staff shortage Positive change to 4 in total
 - Illness 2
 - Secondments 1
 - Awaiting arrival from transfer in 1
- New Cadet William McNutt started early January
- New DSA Megan Blanchard started Mid January
- Cpl. Jared Ryan started early December
- Cst. Chris Watters en-route from Ontario house hunting trip in next couple weeks
- Aux/Cst. Nathan Joyce sworn in and has started volunteer duties.
- **New Police Dog Handler position no cost to the municipality



- COVID has not hindered operations this quarter
- Continuing "hotspot" policing with success
- Community Policing
 - Drive right now for new COP's
 - Crime Prevention Group
 - Float in Christmas Parade
 - Seniors' Police Academy (on hold)
 - Stuff-A-Cruiser very successful
 - Lantz Food Drive 43 Grocery Carts full \$282 in cash
 - Garden Road Food Drive 11 Grocery carts Full Plus toys and \$145 cash

- East Hants Street Crime Unit fully staffed
 - Several Targets identified
 - Local dealer arrested this week more to come
- East Hants Most Wanted
 - Excellent results
 - Tipsters
 - Offenders surrendering
- New Shift UPDATE
 - 4 Watches with a dedicated supervisor (Cpl) embedded in each watch
 - Has been running now since October 4th
 - Feedback remains very high
 - Increased productivity seen
 - Increased morale evident

- Operations remain steady into the winter

 - Wellness checks
 - Motor Vehicle Collisions / Crashes
 - Fire Investigation
 - Scene continuity
 - Investigative capacity
