What is EPR?



Nova Scotia is joining provinces across Canada in implementing Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) for Packaging, Paper Products and Packing-Like Products (PPP) regulations.

This new management of our recycling system will see those who produce and sell packaging and paper taking responsibility for the recycling of those items, both financially and operationally.

These regulations have shown to increase recyclability (design-for-environment improvements), greater end market options (greater volumes and higher quality recyclables), and operational efficiencies that can only be achieved with province-wide systems.

Who are Circular Materials?



Circular Materials is a national not-for-profit organization that builds efficient and effective recycling systems. They are the producer responsibility organization that is responsible for the new system. They have been working with all municipalities and First Nation communities to see that our Nova Scotia program can launch December 1, 2025.

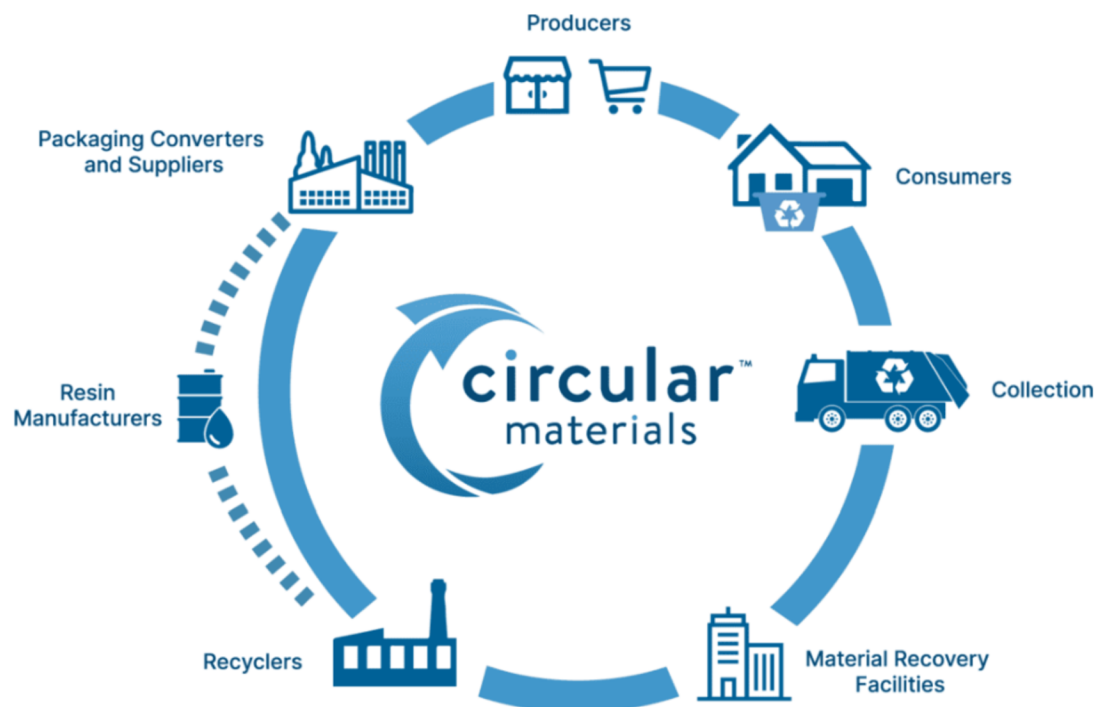
What does this mean for East Hants?



For now, continue to clean and sort your recycling materials.

This process has been years in the making, with provincial regulations passed mid-2023. As discussions continue and likely media coverage will come, we wanted to make sure you were aware of the discussions well in advance.

As more information is finalized, like the full list of additional items to be added to your blue bags, we will provide those updates.

- Top Items:
- Food waste
 - Leaf/yard waste
 - Cat litter
 - Pizza boxes
 - Soiled paper products (e.g. paper towel/bags)

- Plastic, glass or metal
 - Plastic biodegradable bags
 - Dog feces
 - Ashes (hot/cold)



Garbage

- Large household appliances (stove/fridge/dryer)
- Smaller metal items (microwave/bicycle/BBQ)
- Furniture (sofa/mattress/chair)
- Electronics (TV, vacuum, GPS, desktop printers)

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) *not accepted curbside

Same Day Collection with Multiple Trucks ✓

This means some of your materials may be collected earlier than others.

Reporting a Missed Collection ✓

Call the Solid Waste Hotline (same day is best!). Please report after 5 p.m. in case crews are running late and leave a message with your name, number, civic address and concern.

Bungee Cords ✓

Bungee cords or green bin ties can be a potential safety risk to our collection crews, please make sure they are removed on collection day.

Not accepted for Curbside Collection ✓

- Construction & demolition material (e.g., drywall, siding, flooring, insulation, decking, doors etc.)
- Unsorted waste
- Loose garbage inside collection boxes or cans
- Unbundled cardboard (must be flat and wrapped - no boxes inside boxes)

Reminders ✓

- Municipal green carts are for organics only, not regular garbage, plastic or biodegradable/ compostable bags
- Garbage and recycling bags are not to exceed standard sizes (~25 inches x 33")

Businesses & Apartment Owners ✓

Call the Solid Waste Hotline for more information on limits and services.

Organics: 1 green cart (max. 220lbs) ✓

- 6 paper leaf bags
- 5 bundles of brush (2ft x 2ft x 4ft bundles; max 35lbs; no branch diameter larger than 2.5")

Garbage: Limit 5 bags ✓

- No RED, YELLOW or ORANGE bags will be collected
- Black or green bags ONLY
- Max weight 25kg/55lbs per bag
- No construction & renovation waste

Furniture: ✓

- Limit 3 pieces (e.g. sofa or chair)
- Max weight 100kg/220lbs per item

Recyclables: Limit 8 bags/bundles ✓

- Clear or transparent blue bags only
- **Paper products and containers must be separated**
- Max weight 25kg/55lbs per bag

Metal/Electronics: ✓

- 1 larger item (e.g. TV or computer)
- 1 small box of accessories (e.g. cords, remotes, computer mice, keyboards)
- 1 household appliance (e.g. stove)
- 3 smaller items (bicycle, BBQ)

Fees

No tipping fees are charged to residents who bring material directly to the WMC from their own homes and all materials must be sorted correctly.

All industrial, commercial and institutional locations and vehicles will be charged tipping fees, which can be viewed on our website.

Payment can be made by cheque, debit, credit card, or by charge accounts.

To set-up an account, please request an application from the Scale Operator or contact the Municipal Office.

Procedure

- 1 • All vehicles must stop at the scale house
• Declare load
• Get directions
• Confirm if fees are applicable
- 2 • Unload materials at designated zones as directed
- 3 • On exit, stop at scale house and weigh out
• Pay any applicable fees

Larger loads should arrive at the WMC 30-minutes prior to closing to allow for unloading and weigh out.

Reminders

- All material must be sorted
- Loads must be tarped and secured to avoid unintentional littering
- Children and pets must remain inside vehicles at all times
- Treat the site like a construction site, wear proper footwear and bring gloves
- No scavenging allowed on site
- No smoking or vaping on site
- Speed limit on site is 20 km/hr

Construction Waste Management in Nova Scotia

In July 2024, the province updated the regulations on how construction waste can be disposed. These changes impact all communities throughout the province and all landfills - public or private.

Changes

- Enhanced water sampling at facilities
- Stockpile sizing limits
- Movement of treated wood and pressure treated lumber from construction and demolition (C&D) landfill cells to regular waste

This includes creosote timbers and pressure treated lumber e.g. wharves, fences, decks and retaining walls, along with old telephone/power poles and railway ties

What's that mean in East Hants?

The East Hants Waste Management Centre continues to receive your materials.

East Hants Changes Include:

- Implementing any/all environmental monitoring required changes
- Managing stockpiles of various products to ensure compliance (we already do this)
- Direct newly banned materials to regular waste vs. C&D cell (our continued focus)

Reminder: All waste that requires landfilling (regular garbage or construction waste) generated in East Hants is required to be processed at the East Hants Waste Management Centre as per Bylaw IO-400.

Best Practices for Customers

1

Customers are encouraged to consider the various drop-off locations, when loading materials on trucks or trailers for easier unloading when you arrive.

2

Let the Scale Operator know what items you have so they can direct you to the right drop off area.

3

Hiring a contractor or renting a dumpster? Find out what's included in your fees so you aren't charged for mixed loads (a higher rate). Ask for a copy of your slip(s) from our facility so you know that your materials arrived as you expected.

Event Details

- This annual event is open to all residents within East Hants boundaries
- Limit of four (4) bags per household of self-shoveled Grade A compost
- You can pick up compost for one (1) other household as long as you have their registration form. Therefore, you could shovel up to 8 bags of compost per visit
- Bags can hold approx. 25kg each. We will provide the bags and compost—you fill your own bags and place in your vehicle
- You must bring your own shovel (none will be provided)
- We recommend wearing quality gloves and boots/outdoor shoes

Community Groups

- All community groups and not-for-profits within East Hants boundaries are welcome to collect compost after May 22, 2025
- A registration form must be filled out before arriving
- Groups are responsible for filling bags/containers and loading their own vehicles

What is "Grade A" compost?

- There are two (2) grades of compost: Unrestricted (Grade A) and Restricted (Grade B)
- Grade A compost can be used in any application from agricultural lands, residential gardens, horticultural operations, etc.
- Grade B compost is a restricted use product due to higher trace element content and presence of foreign matter
- Test results are available on request

- Medical or radioactive waste
- Commercial or any unknown waste (anything without a label)
- Wet or moist paper
- X-rays, photographs
- Hard cover books, binders
- Electronic media (e.g., CDs)

Please note

To improve traffic flow and safety at our mobile events please ensure:

- That you remain in your vehicle and follow all traffic signs and instructions
- All containers are sealed securely
- Materials are transported in trunks or truck beds
- Materials are in open-topped boxes or totes (we can return them)
- All propane tanks have the valves closed, and there is plenty of ventilation in your vehicle
- Gloves are worn when handling products
- You do not block the flow of main road traffic while attending these events

Put Sharps In Their Place

Our collection partners are seeing an increase of sharps in residential waste. Please make sure sharps are stored in proper containers and disposed of safely.

Pick up and drop off your free Nova Scotia Safe Sharps containers and unused medication at your local pharmacy.



Illegal Dumping

- **Don't Touch It**

If you see an illegal dumpsite, leave the material alone for both your safety and to allow our staff to conduct a thorough investigation.

If you hire a contractor, or ask a friend/family to drop material off, get a copy of the weight ticket to prove it made it to us. (If they are not willing, that might be a flag).



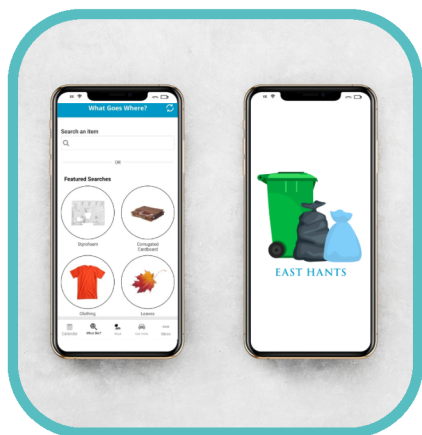
Still Littering
