



Contract Policing Assessment

Process, Timeline, Key Elements

Mandate Commitments

- Conduct an assessment of contract policing in consultation with provinces, territories, municipalities, Indigenous partners, and stakeholders
- Engage with provinces, territories and municipalities that contract RCMP services to better connect the RCMP with community social support workers

Engagement Objectives

- Hear from partners and stakeholders about what is/is not working under the current contracts, and potential visions beyond 2032
- Assessment represents a first step in the renewal process, and the need for a more sustainable and accountable model

Themes

- Governance and accountability
- Program sustainability and cost
- Service delivery
- Program vision beyond 2032

Main Elements

- Provinces and territories (bilateral or group in person/virtual ADM discussions, including participation from RCMP HQ and Divisions)
- Municipalities and municipal associations (4-8 virtual regional discussions)
 - British Columbia
 - Alberta
 - Saskatchewan
 - Manitoba
 - Atlantic region or by province
- Indigenous partners (7-12 virtual sessions)
 - First Nations - 5-8 virtual sessions
 - Inuit - 1 virtual session
 - Metis – 1-3 sessions
 - Modern Treaty and Self-Governing Indigenous groups
- Other stakeholder views collected via written submission (FCM, NPF, police associations) or targeted discussions
