



Subject: District Recreation Fund Applications (Intake 1) for 2024

Summary

This report brings forward District Recreation Fund (DRF) recommendations for Executive Committee consideration and recommendation to Council.

The first DRF intake closed on January 31, 2024. There were 8 grant applications received with funds requested totaling \$181,857. The applications were reviewed by the Staff Grant Committee and evaluated against Council policy. One application is being deferred to the April deadline to allow more time for project readiness. Seven applications meet the policy criteria and have been included in this report.

Council may wish to approve funding from multiple districts where projects benefit facilities and users of facilities that service a large area of the municipality. This report notes under each project where other districts have contributed to previous years' projects.

Financial Impact Statement

The available District Recreation Fund for 2024-2025 is \$717,115. In addition, there is \$3875 remaining in the Gore area rate, and \$156,820 in the Mount Uniacke DRF area rate. This brings the total available funding to \$877,810.

The requests for the first intake totaled \$181,857. The amount being recommended for approval is \$77,278 based on Council policy.

Recommendation

That Council approve the funding recommendations for the DRF grant applications based on discussion at committee pending all supporting documents are complete.

Recommended Motion

Move that Parks, Recreation and Culture Committee recommend that Council approve District Recreation Funding 2024-2025 (intake 1) based on discussion at committee (motion will have details for council).

Background

The District Recreation Funding Program offers annual funding opportunities to groups that provide benefit to the residents of East Hants and offer the development of programs, activities and infrastructure that encourage active and healthy lifestyles.

District Recreation Funding Program Objectives:

- 1. Support community-based organizations to maintain and enhance their recreation facilities.
- 2. Establish criteria which is equitable and consistently applied.
- 3. Maintain accountability when dispersing public recreation funds.
- 4. Support the vision and strategies of municipal strategic plans.

Organizations are first eligible for 50% of project costs. If a districts fund does not have ample funding to meet this threshold, the organization may then receive up to 50% of a district's available funds. In special circumstances, Council may contribute more than 50% of the total project cost or more than 50% of the funds not yet committed in the District Recreation Fund if:

- The applicant is the only organization maintaining a recreation facility in that district;
- There is evidence of significant community support demonstrated by written letters of support from the other eligible organizations;
- The project directly advances municipal plans; or,
- At the direction of Council.

Applications are reviewed for completeness, adherence to policies and evaluated against alignment with municipal recreation priorities and other applications from the district and Municipality.

Staff evaluate the District Recreation Funds applications and make allocations based on policy. Council may wish to consider combining district funds to help accommodate the funding requests or adjust the allocation amount for a particular project.

Discussion

The Staff Grant Committee reviewed all eight applications against Council's policy.

One application (Enfield District School - Accessible Playground Project) is being deferred to the April deadline to allow more time for project readiness. This project doesn't have a completed application at this time, as the group is missing the requirement of 3 quotes for the project work.

The project applicant is the Parent Teacher Association with support from the Vice Principal. When the project was originally discussed with municipal staff, it was to add an accessible playground feature and a shade structure to the school grounds. From the initial conversation, the project has grown to a full playground replacement, updating to a more accessible design and before the end of life of current playground. Full project cost is proposed at approximately \$270,000 with a DRF request of \$75,000. CCRCE is contributing project support in form of procurement and the Parent Teacher Association hopes to raise \$12,000. No other funding is secured at this time, but the group is seeking funding from the Province and other community funds. If this project moves forward in April, it would be staff's recommendation that funds would be released pending confirmation of funding secured from other sources.
