



Budget Reallocations as Approved by Policy

The following is for information only. The CAO has authority to reallocate funds within the Operating Budget, limited to the following:

- Between Cost Centres under the control of a particular department;
- Between Cost Centres for similar types of expenditures, under the control of different departments;
- From reserves, to a maximum of \$15,000, for goods or services of an operating or capital nature that were not identified in the Operating and Capital Budgets, provided that there are special reserves set aside specifically for such expenditures.
