Re: Bakery Lane Paving Petition Results

Please note that a recent petition initiated by residents for the paving of provincially owned Bakery Lane, Enfield was <u>unsuccessful</u>.

Per the Local Improvement Bylaw (F-100), a paving petition is deemed successful if it received support from the properties representing at least two-thirds of the chosen method of charge and the owners representing two-thirds of the total properties. For this petition, a uniform per-lot charge was used for each property.

The results for the Bakery Lane Petition are shown in the table below:

Bylaw F-100 states, where a petition was been conducted and does not receive a 2/3rds (66.67%) majority approval, Council will not proceed with a local improvement, at its own discretion, for a minimum of three years. Property owners are not prevented from requesting subsequent petitions within the three-year timeframe.
