Below is a closer look at each member of the team and the experience they bring to their new roles.

### Cape Breton – Region 1

#### Bruce MacDonald – Regional Operations Manager

Bruce brings a deep understanding of emergency management and strong regional insight to his new role. He previously served as the EMO Coordinator for the Cape Breton Regional Municipality (CBRM), where he led emergency planning, preparedness, and coordination efforts for the region. Bruce's collaborative approach and ability to navigate complex incidents have earned him a strong reputation among both municipal and provincial partners. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Emergency Management from Cape Breton University and brings with him years of hands-on experience in municipal emergency response and planning.

### David Young – Regional Outreach Officer

David joins us with more than 20 years of experience in wildfire and natural hazard response with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), where he served as a Fire Crew Leader. His leadership and operational skills were vital in managing frontline response during some of the province's most challenging wildfire seasons. David is also an instructor with the Canadian Safety Council and a certified Fire Service Instructor, underscoring his commitment to safety and training. Deeply rooted in his community, David brings a grassroots perspective that will help strengthen local outreach and emergency preparedness across the region.

### Antigonish – Region 2

#### Shaun MacLaughlin – Regional Operations Manager

Shaun brings a unique operational and health-based perspective to emergency management, having worked for many years as a paramedic with Emergency Health Services (EHS). In his most recent role, he served as an Emergency Preparedness Special Operations Paramedic, where he contributed to planning and deploying medical responses to large-scale and complex incidents. leadership under pressure and his ability to build relationships across agencies. He holds a diploma in Emergency Management and is deeply committed to integrating emergency health services into broader preparedness efforts.

#### Emily Clegg – Regional Outreach Officer

He also served as the primary liaison for Ground Search and Rescue teams across the province. Shawn's leadership, interagency knowledge, and strategic planning skills will be a major asset to Region 3 and the province overall.

#### Kaitlyn Power – Regional Outreach Officer

Kaitlyn brings a strong background in adult education, psychology, and community-based service delivery. Kaitlyn previously worked as a Case Manager with Pictou Landing First Nation, where she supported families and coordinated service access, often in high-stress or urgent circumstances. ##### Mike Dickie – Regional Operations Manager

Mike brings extensive experience in healthcare emergency preparedness. He most recently served as the Manager of Emergency Preparedness with Nova Scotia Health, where he oversaw planning and response for healthcare facilities across the province. Mike's expertise spans from risk assessments and continuity planning to leading complex response operations during health emergencies. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Security and Emergency Management from the Justice Institute of British Columbia (JIBC) and a Business Continuity designation from the Disaster Recovery Institute. #### Erica Brook – Regional Outreach Officer

Erica is a dynamic public engagement and environmental planning specialist. In her role as a Public Health Engagement Specialist, she led numerous initiatives focused on community-based planning, with a particular emphasis on climate adaptation and mitigation. Erica has worked closely with
