Just back from attending the council meeting discussing the Shubenacadie Cenotaph. We had a decent amount of supporters in the gallery. The dog is not sleeping.

We got a half hearted apology and a scolding from the warden. Perhaps the Warden should go through the info we received from the Foipop and she can read the lies.

For it being said "it was never about parking" there was an awful lot of talk about parking? Greedy, now want 25 spots when 12 were in the original design?

Have the councillors driven through Shubie? There are no businesses and no place to put any. People are not going to lug a hamper of dirty clothes from the proposed parking lot to the laundromat. Better to fix up the upper lot on the other side of the monument.

The cost to move the monument back is almost double what it was to move it initially? It includes demolishing the new base at the legion? Why? Why would you not leave it and put a bronze plaque with a small remembrance.

There will be 2 Remembrance Day services this year in Shubie. I've been contacted by at least 3 dozen people that will be at the original site, where the families of those named on the cenotaph wanted them remembered. How does that factor into the liability issue warden?

The maintenance at the legion is being done by a neighbor across the street. He's mowing and picking up the syringes. Meanwhile the original site has never looked tidier than it does this year.

Hebb and Roulston said it's not where the monument is that's important, it's the remembering those named. It IS about where the families put it 104+ years ago. There was no legion then. The legion was established as a good old boys club where veterans could go to have a drink and tell war stories. We are willing to take this as far as it needs to go to return the Cenotaph to its original spot.
