Again, yesterday our group was met with disrespect. We were chastised by Warden Roulston, what did she expect? Our cenotaph was moved without consultation, THEN councillor MacPhee sends a letter to you, calling HIS constituents SLEEPING DOGS!! His apology was then followed by a "HOWEVER" and he then listed all the weak reasons the cenotaph should remain at the legion. There was never a reason to move the cenotaph, other than parking ...which we have been told time and time (and time) again, that it was never moved for parking, that the legion requested the move. I thank the few councillors who gave heartfelt apologies, but one should never make a TRUE apology followed with a "but" or a "however" and that was done at least twice yesterday.

We aren't giving this up...you made the mistake, you need to fix it. Our young people are watching, we will pass along the history. This is not how politics should work, but in today's climate, it seems that politicians can do whatever they want, with no regard to those who they chose to serve. Is this the legacy you want to leave our young people and our children? Will you be able to proudly say " I was a part of removing a proud community's war cenotaph without considering their feelings?" That is not your finest moment.

I ask that you return the cenotaph to its original location. Perhaps next time remember who you CHOSE to serve. It is not lost on us that Shubie's councillor is against moving it back...isn't it his job to work for the residents of Shubie. While I do know there are those who don't mind the cenotaph at the legion...those same people never complained about where it stood, and they certainly didn't show up to support its remaining at the legion.
