Grant Opportunities

Not-for-Profit Insurance

This municipal grant helps eligible organizations in East Hants pay for insurance and encourages them to have the appropriate insurance coverage. [Applications](#) will be considered on an “as received” basis.

Community Network Grant

As part of the provincial Equity and Anti-Racism Strategy, the [Community Network Grant](#) provides funding to community-based organizations working on projects aligned with the goals of addressing systemic hate, inequity and racism in Nova Scotia. The NS Office of Equity and Anti-Racism (OEA) believes that by empowering community-based organizations, positive and lasting change can be created in our communities.

- Projects can receive up to \$40,000.
- All applications must be submitted by October 31, 2025.

Truth & Reconciliation

Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day.

The **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation** honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Commemoration of the painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of “Every Child Matters”. The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

To help recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day on September 30, below is a list of resources, learning opportunities, and other suggested activities.

- **Have conversations:** Talk with friends, family, and colleagues about the importance of reconciliation and what it means to you.
- Attend a [Sipekne'katik Culture and History Teaching on Sunday and Wednesday evenings](#), more information [HERE](#).
- APTN and the **National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation** invite Canadians to take part in the National Commemorative Gathering: [Remembering the Children – National Day for Truth and Reconciliation](#). This 90-minute commemorative event highlights

survivors as well as Indigenous artists. The event will be broadcast live from Parliament Hill, starting at 3 p.m. (ET) on the APTN channel and on several major television and radio networks.
