Second Reading – Bylaw P-1000-2, an amendment to Bylaw P-1000, Dog Bylaw

The Corporate & Residential Services Committee received a Staff report, as a result of the termination of the contract with the NS SPCA, with proposed amendments to the Dog Bylaw and Municipal Fee Policy regarding impound and boarding fees. Bylaw amendments include definitions of kennel and noise, defining neighborhood and persistently, replaced annual dog tags with lifetime tags and added the option for a dog to be microchipped in lieu of a tag.

Council gave first reading in February and can now proceed with second and final reading.

The Corporate & Residential Services Committee recommends that ***Council give second reading to Bylaw P-1000-2, an amendment to Bylaw P-1000, Dog Bylaw.***
