### Tree Trimming in Horne Settlement

Nova Scotia Power's contractor **Asplundh Tree Services** will be removing trees and branches near power lines in your community.

This work will take place **within the next few months** and is necessary to reduce the risk of outages caused by trees, and to ensure that we can continue to provide safe and reliable power.

#### Here's what to expect:

- Typically, crews will be on-site Monday to Friday from 7 am to 5 pm.
- For safety purposes, traffic control may be required. Please help us protect workers by being extra careful when driving near work sites.
- We will be cutting and trimming trees within 3 metres of our equipment to establish minimum safety clearances.
- Branches and small limbs will be chipped and blown back on to the right-of-way property or transported off site for disposal. Larger wood pieces will be cut up and left neatly on site.
- Shrubs and low growing vegetation will be maintained where possible.
- Some planned power outages may be required to safely complete portions of this work. We will communicate these impacts in advance to minimize disruption.
