Dear Mr. Parks,

As per council motion C26(168), approved in June's meeting of council, the Municipality of East Hants is writing to request Public Works reconsider a Right-In Right-Out requirement where the new Dorey Lane development will connect to Highway 2, Enfield.

Residents have expressed their concerns about the Dorey Lane development as it relates to traffic. Historically, the intersection adjacent, Alderney Drive to Highway 2 has had safety challenges related to sightlines from a hill leading up to the intersection. With the restrictions on the Dorey Lane connection, the public are concerned more traffic will be directed to use the Alderney Lane intersection, where the public believe the intersection at the end of Dorey Lane would be better suited for a full intersection option.

Your consideration on this matter would be appreciated, and the Municipality of East Hants looks forward to working with your team on this item and other opportunities for improvement as they arise.
